

The Paula Carr Diabetes Centre, William Harvey Hospital



The Centre has ramped access and the screening room is on the ground floor for disabled access. Please report to Reception and take a seat in the waiting area right at the end of the corridor (to the right of Reception) and the Screener will call you when ready.

Parking: There is either pay-on-foot and pay & display parking. Enter the hospital site off the mini-roundabout, and should then follow road-side directional signage to the car parks:

Pay-on-foot Main visitor car park: Take the second left and enter through barriers.

Pay & display Channel Day car park: Take the first left and follow the road all the way through the hospital past Estates towards Stores, in order to reach the Channel Day P&D car park at the rear of the site.

Patient drop-off bays are located directly outside the hospital entrances. These are intended for drop-off and pick-up only and we would ask you not to wait or park there as space is limited.

Public Transport: Stagecoach route C provides frequent buses between the hospital and Ashford town centre and rail station. At the town centre connections can be made with buses to and from outlying areas. The hospital is also served by buses from Folkestone, Sandgate, Hythe, Saltwood, Lympne and Sellindge on route 10.

Ashford International is the nearest rail station to the William Harvey Hospital. It is a short walk from the town centre, from where 'bus service 5' runs every 15 minutes. Bus services 10 and 11 also run directly from the station to the hospital. These services both run about once an hour. There are regular direct train services to Ashford International from Tonbridge, Paddock Wood, Margate, Ramsgate, Dover and Folkestone, as well as many other stations.
